Note: Families supplying their own Chromebook need to opt out of the school's purchase program as part of the reenrollment/enrollment process and provide a Chromebook that meets school specifications. Upon approval, base tuition and SOARS fees will be apply.

* (Applied to the total educational cost of every Full-day Kindergarten – 8th Grade student)

**Students who attend FILS middle school for 3 years will own the Chromebook at the end of 8th grade. Students who are in the FIL middle school less than 3 years will need to buy it out. After 1 year, the buyout will be \$250. After 2 years the buyout will be \$125. Should the cost of the Chromebook increase unexpectedly a fee may need to be assessed.
